MONEY SORTED IN D2N2

Year three summary statistics

Money Sorted in D2N2 (Derby, Derbyshire, Nottingham, Nottinghamshire) helps unemployed and economically inactive people with their money management in order to improve financial well-being. The project is delivered through a team of Personal Navigators across the region who work on a one-to-one basis with participants.

Participant profile

Participants accessing the service are often affected by the following issues:



participants have not completed their secondary education



67%

participants feel that they are living in a debt situation which is unmanageable.



participants are affected by a mental health issue*



65%

participants 'regularly borrow money' or 'sometimes borrow money' to buy food or pay for other necessary items because they have run short of money.

Outcomes

Over **2,000** participants have now accessed the project for support.

80% of participants have developed personal/ household budgets with the support of their Personal Navigator.

78% of participants report and demonstrate increased financialmanagement skills and know where to get ongoing financial advice and support

56% of participants have been able to achieve a measurable increase in household income AND a reduction in debt.

62% Participants report increased available income for spending in local shops and business



On average participants have increased their disposable income by **£53.56** a month.
